Dear Mr. Mattiko and Mr. McCleaf,

On behalf of the 29 member companies of the HIMSS Electronic Health Record (EHR) Association, we appreciate the opportunity to offer feedback on the Pennsylvania Immunization Registry's transition to the Pennsylvania Immunization Electronic Registry System (PIERS).

As the national trade association of EHR developers, EHR Association member companies serve the vast majority of hospital, post-acute, specialty-specific, and ambulatory healthcare providers using EHRs and other health IT across the United States. Together, we work to improve the quality and efficiency of care through the adoption and use of innovative, interoperable, and secure health information technology.

In August 2023, our clients began receiving notifications about the shift from the current Statewide Immunization Information System (PA-SIIS) to the new PIERS, with the transition scheduled for January 2024. Upon learning of this, EHR Association member companies sought details such as specifications and timelines through outreach to the Pennsylvania Department of Health (PA DOH).

Regrettably, a number of our members faced challenges in obtaining timely information, with feedback arriving as late as October and full specifications not being received until December 6. While the initial communication from the PA DOH indicated the widespread use of WebIZ[™] across 19 jurisdictions, variations in implementations to meet individual IIS requirements do occur and must be well understood.

Given these challenges and the chosen approach in employing a single cut-over without a transition period in which both SIIS and PIERS are fully available for submissions and queries, the EHR Association expresses significant concern about the achievability of the January 17, 2024 deadline. It is not realistic to ensure that all reporting providers will be ready to switch connections at the same time. As such, an information gap will emerge, impacting vaccine reporting and incomplete vaccination records queries for patients who received services from providers yet to transition.

The EHR Association strongly urges the PA DOH to reconsider the deadline. An appropriate adjustment could either accommodate a transition period in which both registry systems remain available or provide adequate time to ensure that all providers and their systems are prepared to switch simultaneously. We ask that the PA DOH collaborate with providers and their system developers to establish a new, more feasible deadline.

The EHR Association is ready and willing to assist in facilitating a constructive discussion between the PA DOH and Association members supporting providers in Pennsylvania through this crucial transition.
